



STUDY OF ATTITUDE TOWARDS TEACHING AMONG TEACHERS OF DEGREE COLLEGE

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ABSTRACT

The purpose of this study was to find out the attitude towards teaching of teachers of degree colleges. The data was collected on 30 teachers working in JSS Degree colleges. Collected data was analysed with the help of 't' test. The results indicates that the teachers of degree colleges attitude towards teaching is 'moderate'. Further, the study indicates that, there is no significance difference between male and female, rural and urban teachers of JSS degree colleges.

Introduction: Teachers attitude.

Attitude can be defined as an organisation of beliefs, habits and motives, associated with a particular object. "An attitude is readiness to respond in such a way that behaviour is given a certain direction". As defined by Allport (1935). "Attitude is a mental or neural state of readiness, organized through experience, existing a directive or dynamic influence upon individuals response to all objects and situations with which it is related.

A teacher who has a positive attitude towards his teaching can bring the desirable changes in the learners. We have to consider the attitude of teacher towards his profession, the process of learning is going to be a effortless and effectiveness.

Attitude towards teaching can also be changed by experience, teaching profession demands a clear set of goals, love for teaching, good inter personal skills and obviously a favourable attitude towards the teaching. So the present study find the attitude towards teaching of lecturer of degree colleges.

Objectives of the study:

- To find the level of attitude towards teaching among teachers of degree colleges.
- To study the difference between male and female teachers with respect to their attitude towards teaching.
- To study the difference between rural and urban teachers with respect to their attitude towards teaching.

Hypothesis of the study:

- Teachers of degree colleges will have high level of attitude towards teaching.
- There is no significance difference between male and female teachers of degree colleges.
- There is no significance difference between rural and urban teachers of degree colleges.

Tools used for collecting data:

Collecting data for the present study 'attitude towards teaching profession' scale. Developed and standardized by Umme Kulsum (Bangalore) was used.

Result:

The obtained statistics for attitude towards teaching of teachers of degree colleges are given below.

Above the table no. 2 shows that obtain 't' value is significance is 1.29 which is less than the table value 2.601 at both 0.05 and 0.01 level of significance.

Therefore it can be inferred that, there is no significance difference between attitude towards teaching both the male and female teachers of degree colleges.

Above the table no. 3 shows that of that obtain 't' value for rural and urban teachers is 1.26 which is less than table value of 2.601 at both 0.05 and 0.01 level of significance.

Therefore it can be inferred that, there is no significance difference between the attitude towards teaching of rural and urban teachers of degree colleges. null hypothesis is accepted.

Finding of the study:

Following are the findings of the study,

- The attitude towards teaching among teachers of JSS degree colleges is 'moderate'.
- 14% teachers of degree colleges have 'low' attitude towards teaching.
- 13% teachers of degree colleges have 'high' attitude towards teaching.
- Male and female teachers of JSS degree colleges do not differ in their teaching attitude.
- Rural and urban teachers of JSS degree colleges do not differ in their teaching attitude.

Conclusion:

The present study proofs that JSS degree colleges teachers have moderate teaching attitude, so it can be said that they should improve the teaching attitude to high level. Further male and female, rural and urban teachers of JSS degree colleges they do not

differ. Indicates that does not have any effect on their teaching attitude.

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
