COOPERATIVE LEARNING - MEANING

The term 'cooperative learning' is an instructional method in which the students work in small groups. The cooperative learning refers to four quite distinct things. It refers to (1) Cooperative behavior, that means working with or helping others. (2) Cooperative incentive structure, in which a group of two or more individuals are rewarded based on the performance of all group members. (3) Cooperative task structure, in which a group of two or more individuals can or must work together but may or may not receive rewards based on their group's performance and (4) Cooperative motives, the predisposition to act cooperatively or altruistically in a situation that allows individuals a choice between cooperative, competitive, or individualistic behavior. The cooperative learning is essentially a small group instructional technique. In a class for example, forty students may be divided into eight groups of five, and members in the each group study together and receive recognition based on the sum of their individual scores. When individuals work together

toward a common goal, they are dependent on one another's efforts to achieve that goal. This interdependence motivates the individuals to. i) encourage one another to do whatever help the group to succeed. ii) Help one another to do whatever help the group to succeed and iii) like one another, because individuals like others who help them achieve their goals and because cooperation typically increases positive contact among group members. The new approach, namely cooperative learning approach is wider in application in the United States and its importance in India is realized in recent times.

IMPORTANCE OF COOPERATIVE LEARNING TECHNIQUE

Indian classrooms are characterized by large size classrooms and the teachers teach through large group methods such as lecture, lecture - cum - demonstration, etc. It is pointed out that all the students are not able to understand the subject clearly and there is no scope for interaction among the students.
