

Introduction

In 1904, freestyle wrestling was first introduced during the St. Louis Games and was only disputed by American wrestlers. It was only during the fourth Olympic Games held in London in 1908 that competitions were organized for both styles. At the Stockholm Olympic Games in 1912, freestyle wrestling was again absent from the program and glia competitions (Icelandic wrestling) were organized. Wrestling matches took place on three mats in the open air. They lasted one hour, but finalists wrestled without limit of time. The match which confronted the Finnish wrestler Alfred Johan Asikainen and the Russian Martin Klein lasted 11 hours and 40 minutes and appear on the Guinness Book of Records. Both wrestlers, having the same score, were separated by two periods of three minutes of ground wrestling. The Russian finally defeated the Finnish who weighed 8 kilos more than he did. Exhausted by this match, Martin Klein could not beat the Swedish Johansson who won the gold medal for the 75 kilos.

A hundred years after the introduction of freestyle wrestling in the Olympic program, worldwide wrestling entered a new era with the acknowledgement of female wrestling as an Olympic discipline on the occasion of the Athens Games in 2004. This decision is part of the policy of the IOC that aims at establishing equality in sport, and legitimized the efforts made by FILA to sustain the development of female wrestling since the end of the 80s.

The strength of Haryana has always been wrestling and Boxing, but this time in CWG-2010, the Shooters and Athletes have also added to the glory of the state After the Beijing Olympics, the successful organization of CWG-2010, worked as a catalyst to boost the sporting spirit in the youth of Haryana. After the Common Wealth Games 2010, Haryana has emerged as a sports power house of the country with its players winning one third of medals won by the country in the recent Asian and Commonwealth Games. Haryana excelled in games like Boxing, Wrestling, Shooting and Athletics. Area wise Haryana16 is at 20th position population wise 16th position with 2 per cent of total

Two of the three gold medals in Boxing went to Paramjit Samota and Manoj Kumar, both are Haryanvi's. They hail from army backgrounds18 and in fact, Kumar's father was also a boxer. They claim that personal anger about the lack of money and poor infrastructure made them aggressive, which worked in their favor.
