

Library Blogs of Selected Kendriya Vidyalayas of Kerala Region : a State-of-the-Art Study of School Library Blogs in Terms of Theme, Content, Structure and Web 2.0 Tools Used

ABSTRACT

Purpose: The study reports the URLs and domain of seven KV Library blogs, themes and column structure, the variety of widgets used, the link categories provided, the online viewer statistics, the list of web 2.0 tools used, the multi-language readability, special taglines and the 'library information' made available in these blogs

Methodology: Google and KV Librarians Group were browsed and each and every KV Library blog was visited to collect the required data.

Findings: All the 7 library blogs were created in the Wordpress domain. Only three blog addresses start with KV and other 4 blog addresses start with the term 'library'. Six library blogs have created interesting taglines. KV Pattom library blog has 27,79,638 hits followed by KV No.2 Calicut library blog with 12,24,980 hits. three blogs use two column structure and the remaining four blogs use three column structure to present the contents. While four library blogs have sufficient information about the school library concerned, the remaining blogs have got only limited information about school libraries. the library blogs of KV Pattom, No.2 Calicut and Port Trust Cochin have used a good number of widgets while the remaining four blogs have used limited number of widgets. Out of 7 blogs, only four of them have used web 2.0 tools therein. While twitter is used by two blogs, RSS tool has been employed by all the four blogs using web 2.0 tools. KV Pattom and No.2 Calicut libraries have incorporated facebook tool in their blogs. only KV Pattom library has made available their OPAC through their library blog online. And it is the only blog which can be read in Hindi too. Only three blogs viz KV No.2 Calicut, KV Pattom and KV PT Cochin have listed the RSS feeds of few websites, which are useful to the school fraternity. Only two library blogs namely KV Pattom and KV No.2 Calicut have created a good number of link categories. Only KV Pattom blog has created task-specific exclusive blogs for different aspects of a schooling and school librarianship. ive blogs have used Categories and two blogs have not used the powerfulness of 'categories' to present the contents.

Future implications: The study can be further extended to larger number of library blogs of Kendriya Vidyalayas situated across the country.

Social implications: It acts as a guide to the librarians to see where they are and what they lack. It acts as a yardstick to the KVS authorities to bring out a 'School Blog Policy' to standardise the content and presentation of KV Library blogs.

Introduction

Libraries of all breeds are, now-a-days, in their full-fledged efforts to showcase their web presence by all the ways and means. While some of them exhibited the information about the library and library programmes and activities in their institutional websites, few of them have explored the possibilities of creating their own websites/blogs. Very few libraries, in the school environment, have created own websites/blogs on cost. But a large number of school libraries have created their blogs in free web hosting domains like blogger, livejournal, weebly, edublogs and wordpress.

Blogs

A Blog can take the form of a diary, journal, what's new page or links to other websites' - Peter Scott (2001). A weblog is a dynamic, flexible tool that is easy to use whether you are creating with it or simply viewing the results - Richardson (2004). A weblog or blog is a frequently updated website consisting of dated entries arranged in reverse chronological order so that the most recent post appears first - Jill Walker

Library blogs & School Library Blogs

The interactive web pages of a library which is frequently updated showing the posts in the reverse chronological order are called as Library Blogs. A library blog maintained either by the school authorities or the school librarian designed specially to cater to the needs of the students and teaching community of a particular school environment may be defined as a School Library Blog.

Use of School Library Blogs

- To tell about your library - its resources, rules and regulations, services, statistics, magazines / periodicals, Library committee of the year, etc. to the visitors
- New arrivals display service
- Alert Services - Article alert, Magazine/periodical alert, author alert, publisher alert etc.
- Online Information service on Demand / request by the users

- Information Analysis and Consolidation Service (Search, edit, compile and provide service)
- An effective library advocacy tool / marketing tool
- An archive of library circulars / notices / announcements
- Ask your librarian service ; Blog as an on-line digital library
- Current Awareness Service
- To provide scores of lists of useful websites / links to other sites / blogs
- A place holder for showcasing library events and activities (conferences, seminars, meets, cultural eves)
- To display the creative ideas / scholarly articles of the staff / users
- To show the archives / calendar of posts (day-wise, month-wise, year-wise)
- On-line library newsletter
- Site statistics - to see which posts are viewed more ; so future plans can be made accordingly
- WEB OPAC of your library can be placed there
- Automatic e-mail alerts to the interested users whenever a new post is published in your blog
- Library programmes can be brought into light (National Book Week, World Book Day, Dr.S.R.Ranganathan Day, Readers Club etc.)
- Post new book reviews of net sources and of your own users
- List of recommended books (term-wise, course-wise)
- Archive of project works done by the library users
- Online archive of question papers, sample papers, syllabus etc.
- As a reference desk
- To provide announcements of new library acquisitions, notice and various services of the library and
- Conduct on-line polls and user surveys.

Kendriya Vidyalayas

The scheme of Kendriya Vidyalayas (Central Schools) was approved in Nov.1962 by the Govt. of India on the recommendations of the Second Central Pay Commission. It recommended

that the Govt. should develop a scheme to provide uninterrupted education to the wards of transferable wards of transferable central Govt. employees. Central Schools Organization was started as a unit of the Ministry of Education (now MHRD) of the Govt. of India. Initially 20 Regimental schools, then functioning at places having large concentration of defence personnel, were taken over as Central Schools during the academic year 1963-64. The Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan was registered as a society on 15-12-1965. Over the years, the number of Kendriya Vidyalayas steadily increased to 1073 as on 31/3/2011.

Methodology

1. Google Search was done to find out the Kendriya Vidyalayas having library blogs, as the first step.
2. KV Librarians Group (<http://grou.ps/kvlibrarians>) : Secondly, a search was done in the KV Blogs directory available in the KV Librarians Group to trace out the library blogs of KVs in Kerala.
3. 07 library blogs created in wordpress domain were selected by random sampling method.
4. The URLs of these 7 blogs were browsed to get the required information
5. Tabulation was done to present the findings
6. Inferences were drawn based on the tabulated data.

Objectives of the Study

The following are the objectives of this blog survey.

1. To list the URLs and domain of the KV Library blogs, under study
2. To find out the themes and column structure of these blogs
3. To find out the variety of widgets used in these blogs
4. To find out the link categories provided in these blogs
5. To find out the online view statistics as on the third week of December (17.12.2013)
6. To find out the list of web 2.0 tools used in these blogs
7. To find out the multi-language readability and special taglines of these blogs
8. To find out the categories of information available and
9. To list the 'library information' made available in these blogs

Data Analysis and Interpretation

1. Table 1 : URL and Domain

It is inferred from the table that all the 7 library blogs were created in the Wordpress domain. Only three blog addresses start with KV and other 4 blog addresses start with the term 'library'.

It is clear that 6 library blogs have created interesting taglines and one blog has none of that sort. Two blogs have no hit counter and thus visit statistics is not available. Out of the remaining 5 blogs, KV Pattom library blog has 27,79,638 hits followed by KV No.2 Calicut library blog with 12,24,980 hits and KV NTPC Kayankulam library blog with 52,160 hits.

While four library blogs have sufficient information about the school library concerned, the remaining blogs have got only limited information about school libraries. KV Pattom blog leads with maximum quantum and variety of information about the library than any other blog followed by KV NTPC Kayankulam blog. KV Kottayam and KV No.2 Kasaragod may add more information about their libraries in their blogs.

It is clear that the library blogs of KV Pattom, No.2 Calicut and Port Trust Cochin have used a good number of widgets while the remaining four blogs have used limited number of widgets. Out of 7 blogs, only four of them have used web 2.0 tools therein. While twitter is used by two blogs, RSS tool has been employed by all the four blogs using web 2.0 tools. KV Pattom and No.2 Calicut libraries have incorporated facebook tool in their blogs.

It is transparent from table 6 that only KV Pattom library has made available their OPAC through their library blog online. And it is the only blog which can be read in Hindi too. All other blogs can be read only in English.

All the blogs under study are of recent origin. Though KV Pattom library blog is believed to be first KV Library blog, it was not possible to find out the earliest date of posting because of the non-availability of archives widget. Only four library blogs have deployed the archives widget. Out of them, KV NTPC blog has got entries from September 2010 and KV PT Cochin has got posts from January 2012. Only three blogs viz KV No.2 Calicut, KV Pattom and KV PT Cochin have listed the RSS feeds of few websites, which are useful to the school fraternity.

Only two library blogs namely KV Pattom and KV No.2 Calicut have created a good number of link categories covering websites of different subjects. Remaining 6 blogs don't have any link category. Out of seven library blogs under study, only KV Pattom blog has created task-specific exclusive blogs for different aspects of a) schooling like home assignments, e-magazine and book reviews and b) school librarianship like library cloud, librarians network and infolite project etc.

The widget 'Categories' is used by the blogs to present the posts in a classified manner under relevant headings. Five blogs have used Categories and two blogs have not used the powerfulness of 'categories' to present the contents. KV Pattom blog has employed the maximum number of categories followed by KV No 2 Calicut.

Conclusion

It is a welcoming sign that blogging by school libraries in the Kendriya Vidyalayas is gaining prominent in the recent past. Good efforts are being taken by the KV School librarians to meet and satisfy the information requirements of their customers online 24x7. The KVS should take some concrete steps in bringing out a 'School Library Blogging Manual' to regularise and standardise the content and presentation of library blogs of KVs to ensure uniformity, accessibility and to avoid data duplication. Regular workshops and trainings need to be conducted to cone the blogging skills of KV school librarians to prove their mettle in the present online digital revolution.
