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ABSTRACT

Statement of the Problem

Organizations are seeing a drastic change in their work force. A generational shift is happening in the workforce and it's all because of Gen Y entering the work place, Gen Y are more creative and technology savvy people, they are born in the age of technological development, the work place attitude are different from Gen X and baby boomers who are working along with them in the work place. Because of complete change in attitude and with more knowledge of technology the Gen Y employees are not satisfied with their work atmosphere, they are willingly to shift themselves from one organization to the other according to their aspiration and passion, it has become really difficult for the Gen Y employees to remain in an organization for more than 5 years. Millennials have a Propensity to quit shortly after being hired.

Statement of the Purpose

The purpose of this study is to find out reasons why Millennials quit their former employer and what are the reasons to join another employer, What attracts Millennials and suggestion to retain the Millennials in the workplace.

Research Objective

- 1) To find out reasons why Millennials quit their former employer
- 2) To find out what attracts them to join another employer.
- 3) Suggestions to retain the Millennials.

Key Definitions

Millennials – Millennial are also known as Generation Y and they are categorized by the birth year of 1980 to early 2000.

Gen X- Generation X is those individuals born between 1964 and 1979.

Baby Boomers¹- Are those individuals born between 1944 and 1964.

Generational cohort theory – The theory states that generations are defined by unique characteristics and social events that determine values and behaviors that people share.

Trait theory – Trait theory states each person is born with specific traits.

Research Methodology

A qualitative study was undertaken to explore the Voluntary turnover of Millennial from the Millennials' perspective. Qualitative research is a form of inquiry in which researchers seek to interpret and make sense of the meaning individuals ascribe to phenomenon (Creswell, 2007; Denzin & Lincoln, 2005).

In depth Interview with structured questionnaire was conducted to find out the answers for the research objectives. Structured questionnaire was used to collect information.

Criterion sampling technique was used to collect the samples, prior to soliciting participants, the researcher decided who should be sampled and what form of sampling would take place (Creswell, 2007). To ensure all participants experienced the phenomenon, the researcher employed the criterion sampling strategy. This strategy is most often used in qualitative research because it allows the researcher to establish specific requirements and guidelines (Creswell, 2007)

Data was collected through criterion sampling method using structured questionnaire from Millennial population who are born after 1979 and have completed their under graduation course and has moved minimum three organization within a span of five years.

As the time was limited only 89 Millennials were able to be met and the data was collected. The sample size for the research is 89.

To carry out the research, the researcher assumed that the Millennials left the former Organisation Voluntarily.

Interpretation: Table 5 states that 36% of the Millennials Quit the present job because of Lack of growth in the present job, 17% quit due to lack of innovation and creativity in the job, 12% of millennial respondents quit the job due to poor work atmosphere & Potential for greater benefits in the new job, 13% quit the job due to lack of professional happiness and 5% of the Millennials quit the job because of physical health and relationship with Co- workers.

Interpretation; Table 6 states that, 36% of the Millennials quit the present organisation for Higher pay, 22% quit the organisation for Opportunity to grow, 19% for flexibility in work timing, 11% for designation, 9% of the Millennials quit the organisation and join another organisation for creativity and Innovation in the new work place, 2% for Job training.

Findings, Implications and Suggestions

It is very difficult to retain the Millennials, but knowing why Millennial quit the organisation will help us in formulating strategies which will help us to retain Millennials in the work place. This study clearly shows why Millennials quit and what Millennials expect from their new organisation. 36% of our respondent Millennials quit the organisation due to lack of growth, Millennials want to see the clear career graph, they don't want to work in an organisation for the paycheques, they want to climb the ladder soon. Thus one major reason why Millennials quit is because of Lack of growth, Second reason why they Quit is because of Lack of creativity and Innovation in their present job.

What attracts Millennials to the new organisation will help us understand the strategy to retain them, 36% of the Millennials have said higher pay will attract them to join new organisation and at the same time 22% of the Millennials have said that Opportunity to grow will attract them to the new work place.

Suggestions

Managers in the organisation should provide the Millennials with the opportunity to grow and should provide an atmosphere where they can be creative and innovative, and Millennials always like to take up more responsibilities and would like to get personal feedback on their performance. Hence to retain the Millennials the traditional work atmosphere should change and should bring in changes in the levels of hierarchy as Millennials prefer flat structure and they like to work in teams.

Conclusion

A qualitative study using a phenomenological approach explored the voluntary turnover of Millennials from their perspective. Although the participants worked in different industries and organizations, they reported similar experiences in their work environments. India is going to be the world's number 1 country with more number of Millennial population, so it becomes very important to know the basic characteristics of Millennials and the reasons behind why Millennials quit.

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
