A STUDY OF THE POLICE ORGANIZATION OF PUDUCHERRY

KEY WORDS: Police Station, Out Post, Constable, Police Manual.

Raza Police organisation is an itegral part of Indian administrative system. It is utmost importane as its main task is to maintain peaceful environment in society which is the basic precondition for the implementation of governmental policies and of course for the development of a country. ABSTRACT It is important to mention that though Puducherry was a French colony and only after the dejure transfer of on 16th August 1963 Indian laws were made applicable, British influence is dominating the organisational structure, functioning style and various provisions enumerated in police manual.

This research paper presents an overview of the context of the study i.e. policing in puducherry. A brief historical evolution of policing in puducherry is also described. It also takes a stock of the organisational set up and present status of puducherry police. This atricle tried to find the work satisfaction and stress level among puduchery police. Respondents are approached with the questions which they encouter in their daily life.

INTRODUCTION

The police is a state subject and its organisation and working are governed by rules and regulations framed by the state governments. These rules and regulations are outlined in the Police Manuals of the state police forces¹. Various studies on the police force in the country have revealed that while work pressure and complexities in handling law and order and investigating crime have grown at an enormous pace, manpower growth has not been commensurate².

Article 246 of the Constitution of India places the police, public order, courts, prisons, reformatories, borstal and other allied institutions in the State List³. Police administration has two primary concerns: (1) an internal one, the performance of management duties within police organizations; and (2) an external one, the implementation of policies and programs designed to reduce crime and disorder and enhance public safety⁴.

PUDHUCHERRY POLICE

The puducherry police date back to the time of de facto transfer to the Indian Union on November 1st 1954, and dejure transfer on August 16^{th} 1963 subquent to which Indian laws were madeapplicable⁵. Separate armed and indigenous (local) police units were maintained at that time. The modern force still retains the French keep as distinctive feature of its uniform⁶.

The Puducherry police come under the direct control of the department of home affairs, government of Puducherry. The force headed by the director general of police.

As 2003 the Puducherry police had around 4000 personnel, of whom 150 were women. The force plans to induct more women officers to have atleast one woman officer at every police station. The Puducherry police coordinates with other law enforcement agencies across the country offenders and criminals.

District divisions

This territory consists of 4 regions namely Puducherry, Karaikal (Surrounded by Tamil Nadu) and Mahe and Yanam (pockets in Kerala and Andra Pradesh respectively), which were declared into two general Police Districts. The Administration of the Police throughout these two Districts vests in two Senior Superintendents of Police (IPS) or in the absence of an IPS officer, a PPS officer in the rank of Additional Senior Superintendent of Police.

Sub-Divisions and Circles

The two Districts with the four regions were divided into six sub-divisions headed by a Superintendent of Police (PPS) or sometimes an IPS officer in junior scale and each sub division

is further divided into Police circles each with three or four circles except Mahe and Yanam. The SP for the Sub Division is appointed / posted by the Govt. of Puducherry in consultation with the Inspector General of Police. The Police circle is under the operational and supervisory control of the Circle Inspector of Police.

Police Stations

As many as 28 Police Stations and 9 Police Out Posts are notified in this territory as per the following break-up:






